It is the leading global higher education podcast and is sharing ideas that are impacting global higher education futures.

Our work over the past three years has grown and continues with activities and initiatives from across the globe, all dedicated to our central mission of **Changing Higher Education for Good**. This invitation gives an opportunity for you to engage with this sharing of ideas and be a voice in the debate about that mission.

In addition to our podcast series, HEDx has engaged with the global higher education sector in a variety of ways including a successful event series, HEDx Events. Our events since 2022 have partnered with more than 25 university members in Australia and NZ and engaged a live and social media reach of more than 50,000 people.

Our work has generated three books, including *Changing Higher Education for Good*, launched at the 2024 Universities Australia Conference. HEDx engaged with its members and others in materially assisting the Australian Universities Accord higher education review and its consultation and promotion.

HEDx is now partnering with universities and service providers on global events, in Australia, the UK and UAE in the next 12 months. It gives a partnership opportunity for global service providers to connect to leading innovators in the HigherEd sector around the world.

#### **HEDx Conferences**

HEDx 2024/5 Conferences will be held in spring and autumn at maior venues in Australian capital cities. The precise timing, venue and topics will reflect the ongoing feedback from current members, and the realisation of opportunities and priorities as they arise from policy reviews and the ongoing fast-paced technological and equitable development of the landscape of higher education globally.


### HEDx 2024/25 Conferences



Further HEDx 2024/5 conferences will be held in spring and autumn in various locations in Australia and around the world. With a focus on the need for innovation, HEDx conferences will explore and challenge current policy, economic and social context, global best practice and university culture. The HEDx team source leading local and international talent, before curating and facilitating a meaningful and practical dialogue aimed at informing university strategy, culture and student experience.

The HEDx conference format is one of a dynamic event that addresses current and pressing issues for the higher education sector. In 2023/4, the HEDx conferences featured national and international speakers and thought leaders from the world's leading professional services firms and technology companies.

Our Member Institutions' and partners leadership teams and invited clients have the opportunity to attend our high quality HEDx conferences in person. HEDx Live events partnered with the majority of Australian universities since 2022 and reached an audience of over 50,000 through social media. In 2023/4 the HEDx conferences built on our existing value proposition and united the industry in activities associated with the Australian Universities Accord and the launch of *Changing Higher Education for Good*. ### Changing Higher Education for Good Conference

Melbourne March 2024


HEDx kicked off 2024 with its autumn Changing Higher Education for Good Conference on March 21 in Melbourne. Our biggest conference to date, the event saw more than 210 executives and universities from partners throughout Australia and New Zealand dissect the final report from the Universities Accord and respond to other issues of equity, innovation, technology and change as it is occurring in global higher education. Chair of UA Professor David Lloyd gave the opening keynote, fresh from the Accord's release.

The conference featured live cross presentations to international presenters in President Michael Crow of Arizona State University and Ghassan Aouad Chancellor of Abu Dhabi University. Important and valuable conversations continued at an exclusive and private dinner for VCs and DVCS after the event. The conference was widely promoted by Vice Chancellors and partners to their networks, and the social media promotion by HEDx of the event had a reach of more than 22,000 global practitioners.

### **Sector Advocacy and Engagement**

2023/2024 Summary

HEDx live events and conferences came of age in 2023/4 with two major sector gatherings at two critical stages of the Universities Accord consultation. Both were preceded by podcast episodes from interviews with Professor Mary O'Kane, in each case giving a specific and open invitation to HEDx members to engage with the process at a critical time.

HEDx events are disruptive catalysts for sector change. Stimulating new ideas, ways of thinking and a path toward **Changing Higher Education for Good**, HEDx live events engage the higher education sector on critical topics that matter. We have shown we can deliver high quality and high impact events in a sector agendaleading model, to multiple members with multiple partners and are taking those events to a global stage with our partners around the world.











# Latest book launch Changing Higher Education for Good

March 2024

This book sets out an agenda for how global higher education can embrace change. It makes the case and shows the way for how innovation and technology, as part of strategies in new policy contexts, can deliver transformed equity outcomes for global learners.

The book arises from interviews with 50 leaders of universities, employers, technology companies and of policy bodies leading global higher education. It draws on inputs from Australia, the US, UK, Canada, Mexico, Singapore, Japan and New Zealand.


These five themes concern the goal of a more equitable approach to democratised access to learning. They extend to how innovation and technology can be used by learning providers to achieve greater equity. They build into how strategies can be shaped to embrace approaches to innovation and technology. And they culminate in views of how policy can be framed to allow those strategies to thrive both in how governments provide frameworks for providers and in how the collective actions of providers approach competition and collaboration.











#### Previous book launches

## The New Leadership Agenda The New Learning Economy

February, April and July 2023

Leaders from throughout the sector recorded their priorities for leadership in response to the book in the context of the major call for change in the Accord consultation paper launched alongside the launch of this book.

In addition a companion book of *The New Learning Economy* was launched at HEDx partner events at the ASU+GSV Summit in the US in April and the HERDSA Conference in Brisbane in July.

HEDx Live Events in 2023 commenced with a book launch of *The New Leadership Agenda* to open the UA Conference in Canberra.

Vice Chancellors and leaders from more than 20 universities celebrated the major publication of which they had been part, as the Universities Accord was being launched.

# HEDx 2023/4 Executive Briefings with sponsors and partners

Major briefing events with partners were organised and delivered to leaders in the sector which included the following:













- VC and senior executive briefing dinners sponsored by L.E.K. after the Melbourne and Sydney conferences involving more than 35 guests of senior leaders from member organisations.
- A presentation of issues arising from the publication of two books with CIOs of multiple Australian universities at the Microsoft Higher Education Summit shared as a 30 minute recorded executive briefing video.
- A book launch of The New Learning Economy at the ASU+GSV Summit in San Diego in April with 7000 delegates followed by a podcast summit briefing.
- An interview of Mary O'Kane at the HERDSA annual conference subsequently released as a HEDx podcast briefing.
- August 16th and September 19th webinars on student support needs in response to changes in the Support Amendment Bill joint with Vygo and made available as executive briefings on a podcast.
- An Executive Roundtable Briefing in partnership with Adobe exploring the missing elements of technology in the Accord interim report.

Partner events of this nature will be extended and explored with partners for 2024/25.
